California offers some of the world's finest public golf courses, with green fees ranging from \$20 to \$255, including golf carts. Many of these golf courses are situated in Orange County, and in the San Diego and Los Angeles areas. Texas: The city of Houston boasts 143 public golf courses. According to an industry-leading sports magazine Golf Digest, some of the courses found in Houston are classified among the world's best.

Myrtle Beach: The city of Myrtle Beach has proclaimed itself "Golfing Capital of the World". The golf course-to-land ratio here is so dense, that there really is no other place in the world that can claim this title. The Grand Stand is one of the best courses that Myrtle Beach has to offer. In total there are at least 115 holes, with two of them making it to Golf Week's list of the Top 200. The best thing about the public golf courses in Myrtle Beach is that they really are easy on the budget. There are courses to meet every preference, from low to high end, and every level in between.

Hawaii: Some of the world's best public golf courses can be found on this fairytale island. Known as "Golfer's Paradise" for its perfectly dreamy setting, Hawaii offers the perfect combination of pristine scenery, ideal weather and even the slopes of the land. Many of the world's most highly respected golf architects have spent time in Hawaii, and have also developed and improved public golf courses on Maui, Kauai and Oahu.
